STATISTICS SHOW THAT ...

Reading for 20 minutes a day exposes children to a vast quantity of words. This in turn raises academic standards across the curriculum in all subjects. We are simply asking our pupils to try read EVERY DAY, even during the holidays and on the weekends. Teachers will calculate the total number of minutes read by each class using the AR and PM reading systems already in place in school. The total minutes read per class will be tallied. As a school we will endeavour to reach a total of 50,000 minutes by December 20th!
